Dear Co-Chairs Ruth Mahoney and Havidan Rodriguez;

I need to raise a concern that affects millions of our fellow New Yorkers' health and well-being. I urge you to follow the Biden Administration's lead and prioritize workers in the dietary supplement manufacturing and retailing industries to receive vaccines against COVID-19 in Phase 1b. In February of 2021, the federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), whose members were appointed by the United States Department of Health and Human Services secretary, created a list of industries and ranked their place in the vaccine priority line. ACIP recommended phased allocation of COVID-19 vaccines while vaccine supply is limited. Food and beverage industry workers, including those in the supplement business, are considered frontline essential workers and recommended to receive vaccines in Phase 1b. Phase 1a includes health care personnel and long-term care facility residents, and Phase 1b includes people older than 75 as well as frontline essential workers.

There is uncertainty right now created by New York's interpretation on whether health and nutrition stores have been deemed essential retail establishments. For the millions of people who rely on stores that retail dietary supplements, this uncertainty is troubling. It could cause such stores to close unnecessarily and not allow their front-line workers to access vaccination.

This issue could be resolved if the state revised its language in the current guidance that health and nutrition stores were apart of Phase 1b. Dietary supplement manufacturers are specifically referred to as essential in the latest CISA guidance (version 4.0), which would be consistent with that existing policy. The whole supply chain would have access to vaccination. The millions who use dietary supplements to stay healthy would continue to do so uninterrupted. Their continued access is critical, especially at a time when health is so important.

Most importantly, this revision of policy would be consistent with New York's guiding principles of vaccine rollout. By clarifying that the over 31,000 workers in the dietary supplement industry are a part of New York's Phase 1b, New York State will be a shining example of prioritizing safety and ensuring an efficient and organized vaccine distribution.
